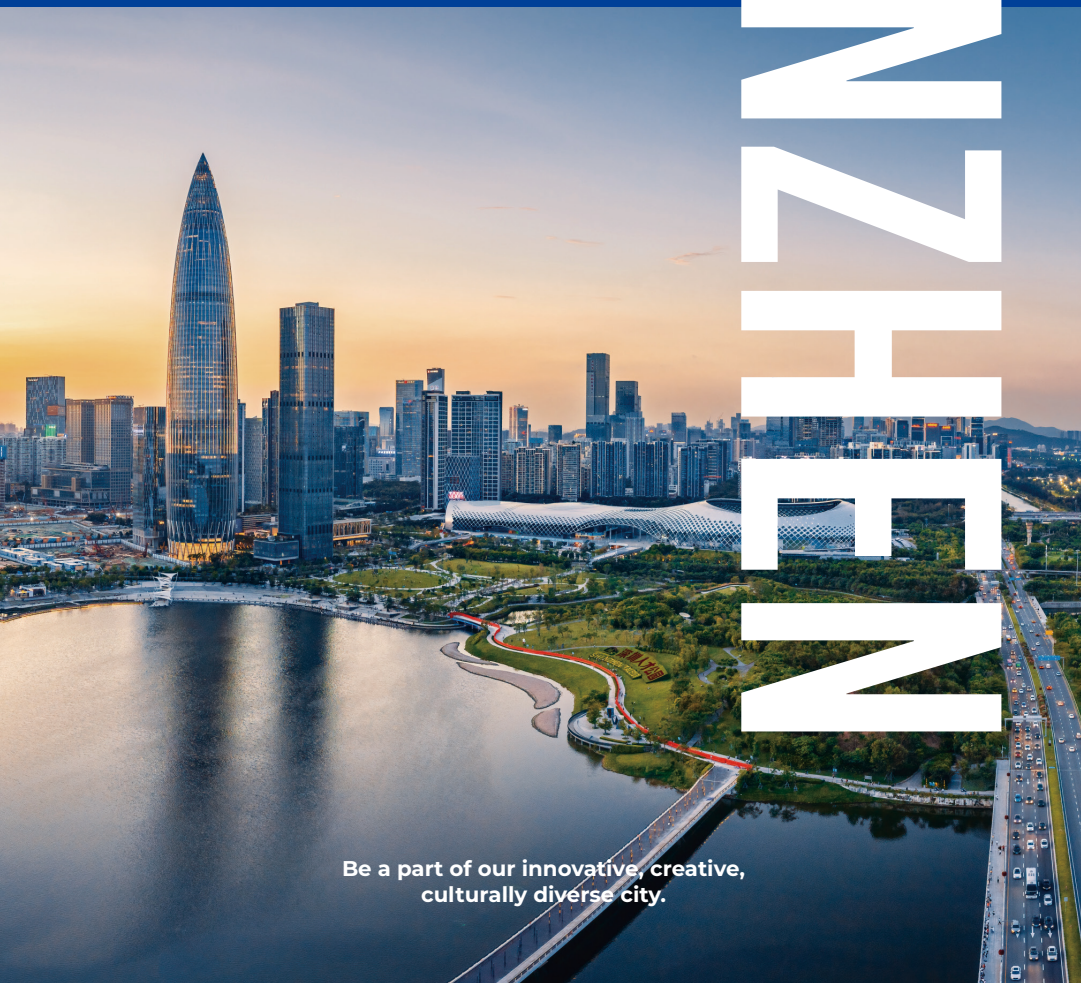

Service centers for expats

Shenzhen has established one-stop service centers for foreigners at major entry checkpoints, covering essential needs and services such as payment, communication, transportation, culture, tourism and immigration.

Information Overview



Payment Services:

Assistance in linking WeChat Pay and Alipay, cash withdrawal with foreign cards, foreign currency exchange, and small-change conversion services.



Communication Services:

On-site SIM card applications and telecom service consultation.



Transportation Services:

Sales and top-up of Shenzhentong travel cards, plus public transportation guidance.



Culture & Tourism Services:

Tourist information, itinerary planning, ticket booking, cultural tours, app recommendations for travel in Shenzhen, and the latest travel and consumption updates.



Immigration Services:

Q&A on entry/exit policies, visa assistance, and legal briefings for expats.

Visa on Arrival

Foreign nationals holding ordinary passports who have urgent needs to enter China, but do not have enough time to apply for visas at Chinese embassies or consulates abroad can apply for port visas for entry. Foreign nationals applying for port visas can submit applications in advance to the port visa authorities by themselves or through inviting parties, or apply on site upon arrival at ports in China.

Residence registration

You should register your accommodation with the local police within 24 hours of arriving in Shenzhen.

Registering your accommodation

If you are staying in a hotel, hostel, short-term rental, or guesthouse, the staff who check you in will do this for you. If you are staying at a private residence, including your own, you or your host must complete the residence registration process. You can do this online or in person.



Work permits

You need to obtain a work permit and a work-type residence permit to legally work in China. Typically, your Chinese employer will help you apply for both.

Residence permits and visas

Foreigners who enter Shenzhen and need to reside or remain in the country for reasons other than diplomatic or official purposes shall file an application at the exit and entry departments of public security organs for the issuance, extension, change, and re-issuance of a residence permit, visa, or stay permit.

Payment Methods

Foreigners in Shenzhen can use mobile payment easily, even without a Chinese mainland bank card or phone number, by linking an overseas bank card to major mobile payment platforms through the following methods:

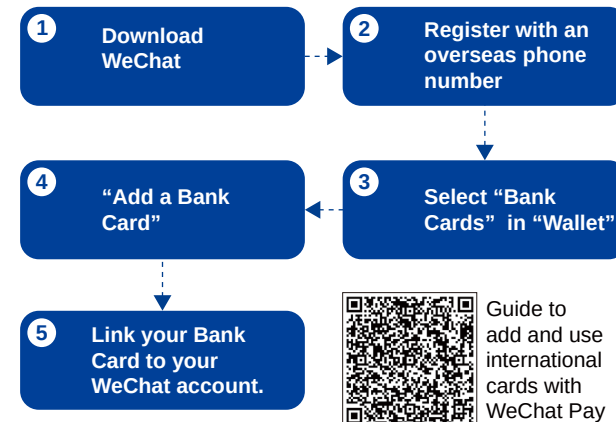

Opening a bank account

To apply for a bank card at a domestic branch, you typically need to present valid identification, such as a passport or a foreigner's permanent residence ID card. For specific requirements, please contact your nearest bank branch or the bank's customer service hotline.

Nihao Mobile

You can also get a SIM card at Nihao Mobile, which offers English service, fast delivery, and supports multiple payment options for expats.

Broadband

You can set up broadband at any official outlet of the major telecom service providers listed above (subject to coverage in your local community) with your passport or foreigner's permanent residence ID card and address.

Note: Loss of a mobile phone

Call your telecom service provider and report the loss.
Freeze online banking service and e-payment accounts, such as WeChat Pay and Alipay.
Change passwords on your social media accounts.

Transport

The city's convenient public transport system will take you away from the high-rises of downtown business centers and let you soak up local culture in ancient Hakka villages in the mountains and by the sea within an hour. You can call that Shenzhen Speed!

Trains

Intercity railways connect Shenzhen to the rest of China. Major railway stations in Shenzhen include Shenzhen North Railway Station, Futian Railway Station, and Pingshan Railway Station. Shenzhen Railway Station also offers some high-speed train services.

Note: You can buy train tickets with your passport at the ticket offices or on the 12306 app and Trip.com (available in English).

Metro

Shenzhen's Metro network now has 16 lines in service, operated by Shenzhen Metro Group Co. Ltd. and Hong Kong MTR Corporation (Shenzhen) Ltd. Fares are distance-based, starting at 2 yuan (US\$0.27) per ride.

Buses

Public bus routes take people to most of the communities around Shenzhen. Fares usually range from 2 yuan (US\$0.27) to 10 yuan (US\$1.38) per person.

Please note that exact cash payment is required, as no change will be given. Alternatively, you can use a transportation card or opt for e-payment methods.

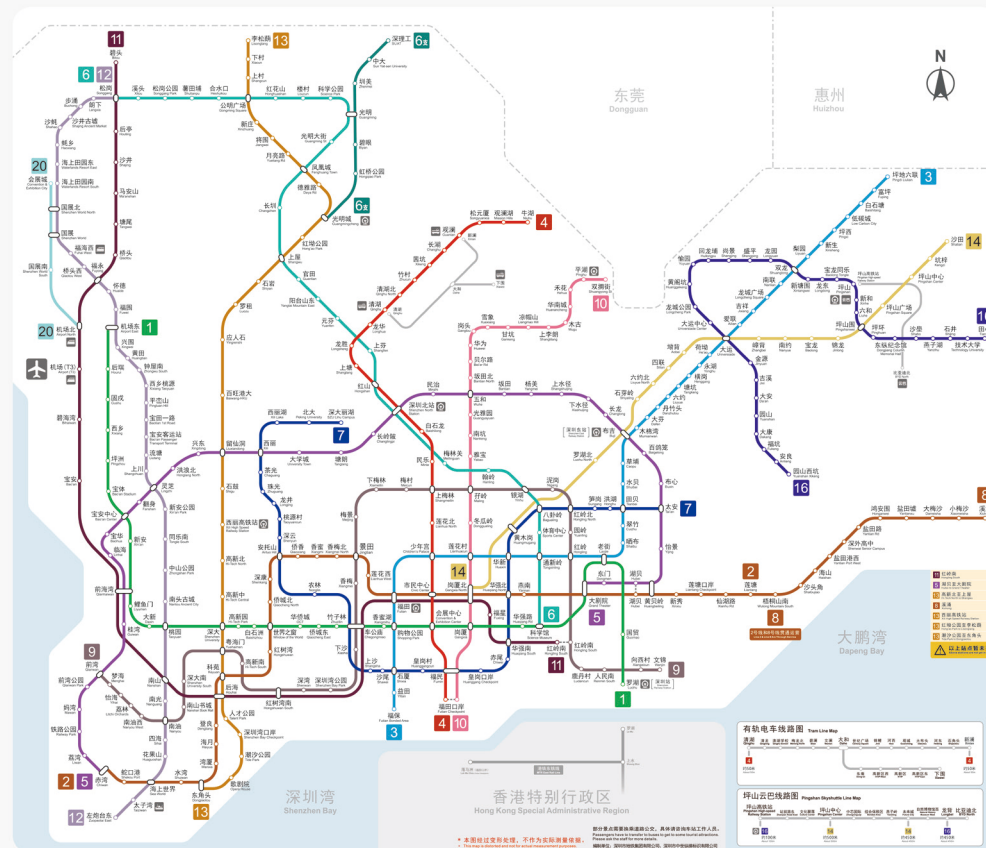

Shared bikes

Internet-based bike-sharing services became available in Shenzhen in October 2016 and have since seen rapid development. At present, the major shared bike operators in the city are Meituan Bike (yellow), DiDi Bike (mint and white), and Hellobike (blue and white).



"Yellow Cap" cabs

Shenzhen Bus Group has equipped its 6,000 taxis in "little yellow cap" with the AI-powered translation device "MossTalk." These taxis feature distinctive yellow roof lights, making them easy to recognize.

MossTalk supports two-way translation in more than 140 languages and can operate offline, offering international visitors in Shenzhen a more convenient travel experience.

Housing

Many people rely on real estate companies to find an apartment. It is important to carefully review the contract and thoroughly check the property before signing a contract.

Renting a property

When signing a lease, remember to bring your passport and residence permit, visa, or foreigner's permanent residence ID card. After signing the lease, remember to head to the local police station or management center for expats within 24 hours to register your new accommodation.

RENT

Paid in advance monthly or every three/six/twelve months. Negotiate payment schedule with the property owner.

DEPOSIT

Returned after tenancy ends. Usually equal to 1 or 2 months of rent.

MANAGEMENT FEE

Property maintenance. Paid monthly.

COMMISSION

Paid to real estate agency. Usually half a month or a month worth of rent.

UTILITIES

Usually paid monthly by the tenant.

Daily Necessities



Utility bills

You have various options to make payments. The easiest way to pay your bills is by using e-payment platforms like WeChat Pay or Alipay.



WiFi

Free WiFi is available in most public places such as train stations, the airport, cafes, restaurants, and malls.



Housekeeping

Having a domestic helper (ayi) can help make life much easier. They generally offer a range of services, such as cleaning, cooking, and child care. Ask your property management company, neighbors, or friends for recommendations.



Delivery services

Many companies provide courier services, ranging from local direct delivery to international shipping. You must present your passport or foreigner's permanent residence ID card when sending a parcel.

SF Express is a reliable delivery choice. EMS, run by China Post, offers domestic and international delivery services. International express brands like DHL, UPS, and FedEx also offer service in China.



Education

Shenzhen has established a well-functioned education system. There are a number of international schools for the children of expats.

Medical Care

Health insurance

Expats working in Shenzhen will be covered by social security, which includes pension, medical insurance, employment injury insurance, unemployment insurance, and maternity insurance.

Hospitals

Shenzhen has both public and private healthcare facilities. Many of these facilities offer medical care in various languages, including English.

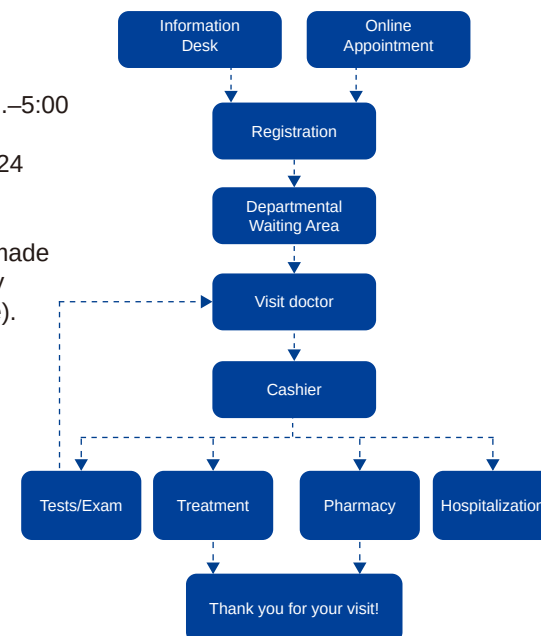

Dubbed the city of 1,000 parks, Shenzhen boasts 1,290 parks. It also has a wealth of serene greenways, exuberant wetlands, and picturesque beaches that provide visitors with an opportunity to escape from the bustle of urban life and return to nature.

Mangroves

The city has 296.18 hectares of mangroves which are mainly found in the Futian Mangrove Nature Reserve and partly in Shajing, Fuyong and Xixiang in Bao'an District, Shahe in Nanshan District, and Baguang, Kuichong and Nan'ao in Dapeng New Area.

The Futian Mangrove Nature Reserve has been listed as one of the key protection organizations by the International Union for Conservation of Nature and is one of the Chinese organizations of the Man and Biosphere Programme.

The 14th Meeting of the Conference of the Contracting Parties to the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands (COP14) in Switzerland's Geneva officially passed a draft resolution on building an international mangrove center in Shenzhen on Nov. 13, 2022.



Urban Landmarks

Shenzhen Art Museum (New Venue)

The Shenzhen Art Museum (New Venue) boasts a construction area of 66,000 square meters, with an exhibition area of 16,000 square meters and a semi-outdoor sculpture exhibition area of 3,900 square meters. The facility houses 18 art exhibition halls and auxiliary spaces including an art gallery, an academic lecture hall, an art library, a volunteer service space, and an artistic derivative store.

Shenzhen Science and Technology Museum

The Shenzhen Science and Technology Museum is located in the heart of Guangming Science City. The 128,300-square-meter museum is divided into seven major functional zones and four permanent exhibition halls that incorporate digital experiences. By presenting cutting-edge scientific and technological achievements, the museum is committed to popular science education and stimulating the public's enthusiasm for scientific exploration.

Sports Venues

Shenzhen Universiade Center

Shenzhen Universiade Center consists of a main stadium, a main gymnasium, a natatorium and other fitness facilities. It served as the main venue of the 26th Summer Universiade in 2011, and is one of the venues for the 15th National Games.

Shenzhen Sports Center

The upgraded Shenzhen Sports Center in Futian District is a new sports landmark in the city. Its main facilities include a 45,000-seat stadium, a 15,000-seat gymnasium, and a swimming and diving hall.

Shenzhen Bay Sports Center

Nicknamed "Spring Cocoon," the Shenzhen Bay Sports Center is one of Shenzhen's most iconic landmarks. It comprises a 20,000-seat stadium, a 13,000-seat gymnasium, a natatorium, and other facilities.

Shenzhen, China's youngest city, is full of vitality. In this land of potential, an increasing number of trendsetting cultural and sports events, world-renowned exhibitions and conventions, and traditional festivals are becoming a defining feature of the city.

Shenzhen Bay MixC

Located amid landmarks such as the China Resources Tower, Shenzhen Bay Sports Center and Shenzhen Bay Culture Square in the Houhai commercial area, the Phase II project reinforces its status as one of Shenzhen's major retail destinations by adding nearly 300 new brands, including more than 120 first stores. It brings the combined Shenzhen Bay MixC ecosystem to more than 500 brands across both phases. With a floor space of over 150,000 square meters, the shopping center has dedicated more than 60,000 square meters to cultural programming, including the Shenzhen Bay Art Museum, an immersive theater and a digital art center. Although those cultural facilities are scheduled to open by 2026, a large-scale cultural program, the "Bay to Art" MixC Art Season has launched with more than 100 art and cultural experiences already on offer.

Shopping Paradise

Shenzhen stands out as a burgeoning consumer paradise, a realm not only rich in international luxury goods but also brimming with unique local products. Amid opulent shopping centers and chic boutiques spread across the city, there exist down-to-earth wholesale markets and bargain shopping areas where quality wares are priced for value shoppers, notably the Huaqiangbei electronics street, the Shuibei jewelry cluster, and the Henggang glasses town.

Shenzhen Joy City

Featuring nearly 400 brands, Shenzhen Joy City stands out with its diverse commercial offerings and innovative operational model. It is Shenzhen's first art and trend-themed street, first rooftop urban social space, and first youth culture and entertainment hub.

As the flagship commercial property of COFCO Group, the mall occupies a prime location in the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area — the heart of the Qianhai-Bao'an CBD. The mall has a total floor area of 250,000 square meters.

Shenzhen Antique City

A vast selection of mostly reproduction antique furniture, calligraphy, porcelain, and jadeite items is available here.

Genuine antiques can be quite expensive, so be prepared to pay a premium and make sure to obtain proper certification. Please note that items dated before 1795 are prohibited from being taken out of China. Shenzhen Antique City is located within the faux historic Chinese-style buildings, about 300 meters west of the subway exit. It's also an excellent place to purchase tea sets. Bargaining is customary and expected.

Shuibei International Jewelry City

For all that glitters, head to this jewelry trading market built on a truly Shenzhen scale. With 200 retailers stocking everything from agate to zircon, it helps to know what you're looking for. There are also places selling all manner of jewelry accessories and tools if you want to make your own. A marked trail through the complex takes shoppers from one zone to another.

Tax Refund for Departing Travelers

The departure tax refund policy allows travelers from outside the Chinese mainland to claim a refund of value-added tax (VAT) on goods purchased at designated tax-free stores when leaving the mainland through eligible checkpoints. Travelers from outside the Chinese mainland include foreigners and residents of Hong Kong, Macao, and Taiwan who stay on the Chinese mainland for no more than 183 consecutive days. Valid ID documents include passports, Mainland Travel Permits for Hong Kong and Macao Residents, and Mainland Travel Permits for Taiwan Residents.

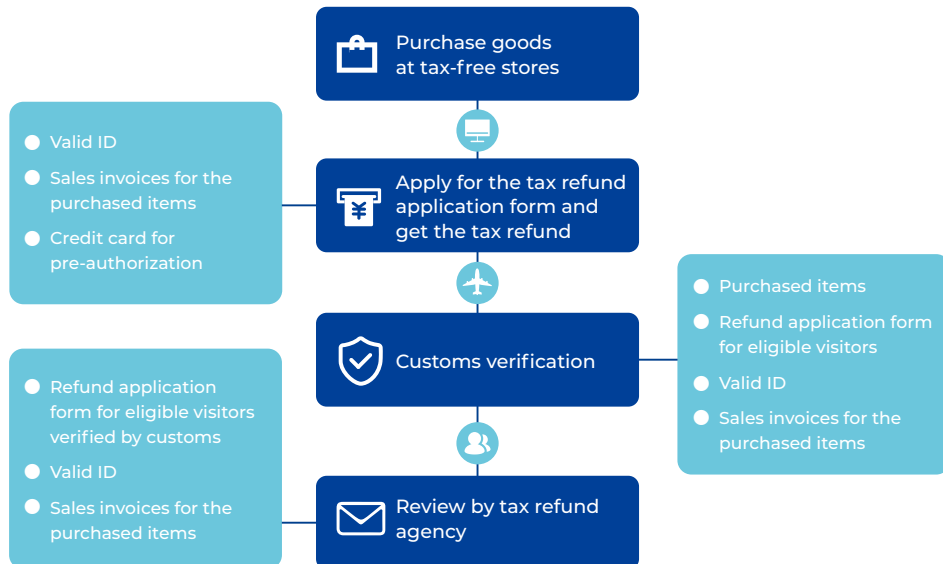

* The shop is equipped with POS terminals for international bank cards and digital renminbi payment options, making transactions convenient for overseas visitors. It also provides a "refund-upon-purchase" service for departing travelers.

City Center Line

This loop line departs from and returns to Window of the World, covering classic landmarks in Nanshan, Futian, and Luohu districts. This route is ideal for first-time visitors or those showing friends around Shenzhen to experience the city's culture and modern urban charm.

Blue Coast Line

You can visit the K11 ECOAST cultural and retail complex, stroll along Dasha River Ecological Corridor, often called Shenzhen's version of the Seine River, savor a wide variety of international cuisines and enjoy art exhibitions at Sea World, and admire colorful flowers at Lijuhua Hill Park.

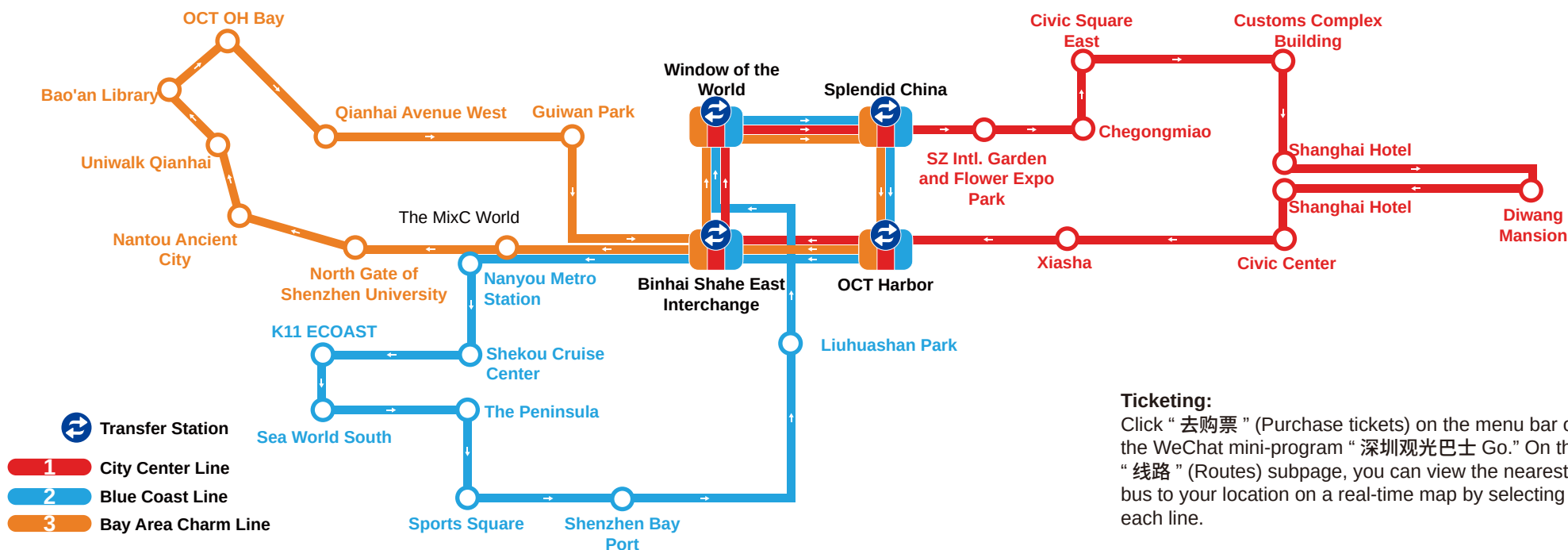

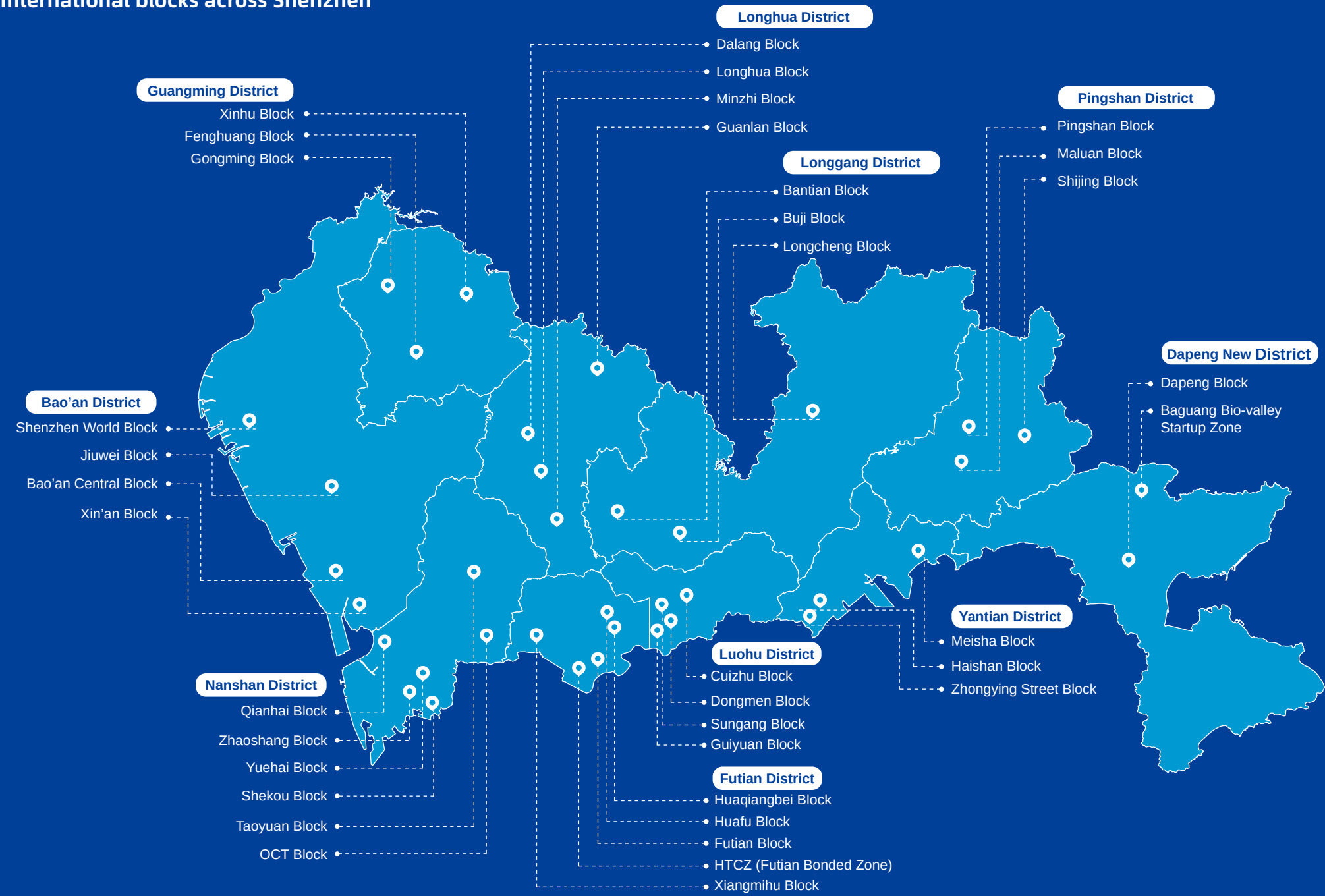
